Cetaphil Restoraderm Eczema Calming Body Moisturizer, drugstores, \$19

"A top-notch moisturizer that soaks right in and doesn't leave skin sticky," says Amy Wechsler, MD, a dermatologist in NYC.

Dove Sensitive Skin Beauty Bar, drugstores, \$3 per 2-pack

"My go-to cleanser—it cleans skin without irritating," says Wechsler. "I bring it with me whenever I travel."

Pond's Cold Cream Cleanser, drugstores, \$8

"Hands down, the easiest way to remove makeup," says Joy Fennell, a makeup artist in NYC. It's been around for decades for a really good reason—it works.

Elizabeth Arden Eight Hour Cream Skin Protectant, elizabetharden.com, \$22

"Good for literally everything—flaky lips, dry skin, rough cuticles and fun hacks like glossy lids," says Fennell.

CeraVe Renewing SA Cream, drugstores, \$19

"The fix for rough patches on upper arms and legs," says Kristina Goldenberg, MD, founder of Goldenberg Dermatology in NYC. The salicylic acid removes dead skin cells—bumps gradually disappear and skin becomes smoother and softer.

Olay Active Hydrating Beauty Fluid Lotion, drugstores, \$8.50

"I love the simplicity— and efficacy—of this lightweight moisturizer," says Goldenberg. Sometimes the simpler the ingredients, the more effective the product.
