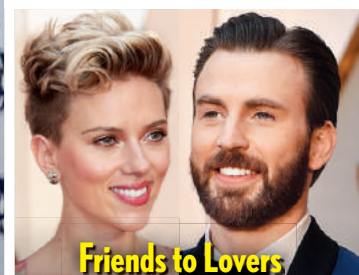

A million reasons — that's what women in the spotlight sometimes find to justify getting (and overdoing!) plastic surgery. The same cannot be said for Lady Gaga. "Her structural framework seems similar," says NYC-based plastic surgeon Dr. Ryan Neinstein, who, like the other experts quoted in this story, hasn't treated the star. He thinks Gaga's had just the right amount of tweaks and has been particularly smart about how she's maintained her skin. "She's likely had new collagen stimulated through laser treatment [cost: \$3.5K]. It looks really good." NYC-based

dermatologist Dr. Gary Goldenberg agrees, adding that the singer also shows "few signs of sun damage," which is another sign of a good laser treatment. Also upgraded? "Her lips," asserts Troy, Mich.-based plastic surgeon Dr. Anthony Youn. "They look more plump and pouty, so I suspect she's had some filler there, as well as in her cheeks." It's clear that Gaga, 31, who once admitted to being "obsessed" with facial injections, has learned what works. Says Dr. Youn: "She looks great!" **LS**

EYES

"Her eyes are more open now, which adds to her beauty," says LA-based cosmetic surgeon Dr. Alexander Rivkin. The results can be achieved with Botox (\$300 every three to four months).

CHEEKS

Dr. Youn suspects a filler like Voluma was used to sculpt the songstress' cheeks. "They look higher and more chiseled," he says. Price tag? \$2K.

LIPS

Dr. Rivkin thinks a filler, most likely Juvéderm, is at work in her lips. "They look full and natural and not overdone," he praises. (Cost of upkeep: \$650 to \$1.3K every seven to nine months.)

CHIN

"She looks like she has had a bit of filling done around the chin to smooth out her jaw," says Dr. Rivkin. A filler like Voluma goes for an estimated \$1.2K a pop.
